HIKERS EASTER SUNRISE SERVICE

April 15, 2020 6:20 am (approximately)

This service has been planned specifically for our situation this year with the CoVID-19 virus and the current social distancing regulations. It is recommended for couples or very small groups. Participants would need to maintain a six-foot distance during the hike and then throughout the service at the top of the mountain.

You'll need to plan ahead so that you leave your home and arrive at the trailhead with enough time to hike up to the top by 6:20 or a little earlier. You will need a headlamp or a flashlight.

You could also do this in your back yard, a local park, or anywhere, as long as you do not congregate with others.

AT THE TRAILHEAD, BEFORE YOU BEGIN TO HIKE

• Read:

It was now about the sixth hour, and darkness came over the whole land until the ninth hour, for the sun stopped shining. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two. Jesus called out with a loud voice, "Father, into Your hands I commit my spirit!" When He had said this, He breathed His last. Luke 23:44-46

- Recall the words of Isaiah the prophet, *"The people [were] walking in darkness..."* Isaiah 9:2a
- Recite: Oh, Lord, let my soul rise to meet you as the day rises to meet the sun.

HIKE IN SILENCE

AT THE TOP

- Shout responsively: He is risen! He is risen indeed!
- Sing one of the suggested songs or a song of your choice.
- Read Matthew 28:1-10 NLT

28 Early on Sunday morning, as the new day was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went out to visit the tomb. 2 Suddenly there was a great earthquake! For an angel of the Lord came down from heaven, rolled aside the stone, and sat on it. 3 His face shone like lightning, and his clothing was as white as snow. 4 The guards shook with fear when they saw him, and they fell into a dead faint. 5 Then the angel spoke to the women. "Don't be afraid!" he said. "I know you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. 6 He isn't here! He is risen from the dead, just as he said would happen. Come, see where his body was lying. 7 And now, go quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead, and he is going ahead of you to Galilee. You will see him there. Remember what I have told you." 8 The women ran quickly from the tomb. They were very frightened but also filled with great joy, and they rushed to give the disciples the angel's message. 9 And as they went, Jesus met them and greeted them. And they ran to him, grasped his feet, and worshiped him. 10 Then Jesus said to them, "Don't be afraid! Go tell my brothers to leave for Galilee, and they will see me there."

- Sing one of the suggested songs or a song of your choice.
- Conclude with the following Easter Blessing*:

May the celebration of resurrected life bring new hope to your being. May the victory over earthly death turn your eyes to the promises of heaven. May the empty tomb help you to leave your sorrows at the foot of the cross. So that God's hope, promises, and forgiveness reign in your life forever. Amen.
