## A Resource from SLD Center Journal a six week exploration of scripture. a daily rhythm for your journey.



Center Journal

Lent, a Christian tradition, is a period of about six weeks before Easter. It is a time when Christians are supposed to be quiet and thoughtful, preparing themselves for Easter. It is a time of refiection, prayer, and sacrifice in unity with the sacrifice Christ made on Good Friday. The period of Lent ends at Easter, which is a time of great celebration as the Christians think of how Jesus died on the cross but then rose again from the dead.

Lent is traditionally supposed to be forty days long. This is in observance of the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness, preparing for his ultimate death and resurrection.

This Lenten Journal is designed to be a simple daily rhythm for your journey. Each day you will be presented with short portions of Scripture from the Old and New Testament in accordance with the lectionary. The journal then gives you basic prompts to help you consider what the Lord is saying to you and then allows you to respond.

Lent on the calendar may look a little different every year. This journal is designed to be used any year. Begin with Ash Wednesday and follow the readings. Then, if necessary, "jump" to Palm Sunday as the calendar dictates.

Every day, the journal experience will contain the following prompts:

- Schipture -The Scripture will contain short portions to allow you to refiect on the Lord's message to you for the day.
- Degewation What word or phrase from the daily Scripture catches your attention? Write it down in the space provided. It is amazing how the Lord works through the simple act of writing out the sacred word(s).
- Application What is God saying to you through the words that caught your attention? How does it apply to something you are living through right now?
- Proyen After you have had time to read, observe, and apply, write a simple prayer. This could be a prayer of thanks, a request for guidance, or a prayer for forgiveness.

Each one of these steps must be simple. You do not have to write an epistle! If you keep it simple by writing a few words or a sentence or two in each space will be far more successful in incorporating this rhythm into your Lenten journey.

If you miss a day or days, don't give up. Instead, pick up on the week and day of the Lenten calendar spelled out in the journal (i.e., 2nd week of Lent, Friday). God is not grading you but relishes your desire and intention to be with him in this discipline.

The final pages are for your final reflection of what you have learned through this journey.

Please note that all Scripture is taken from The Message translation.

Here is a prayer as you begin:

Lord, you have promised to meet those who seek your face. Come now and reveal your presence to me as I make myself present to you. In the name of Jesus Christ, my Lord, I pray.


